>>> *What are your main duties?*

As an officer within the AML/CFT Supervision Division my duties are centred around AML/CFT supervision for all regulated and registered firms in the Isle of Man. The role is varied, but a key part involves undertaking AML/CFT-focused inspections to assess compliance with the AML/CFT Code. These inspections have many variables, including both thematic and event driven undertakings, which keeps it interesting and allows for coverage of all different business sectors.

>>> *What are the most important qualities you need in your role?*

A willingness to work as part of a team in a fluid and adaptable manner to meet the targets set for the Division, many of which require collaboration with stakeholders both internally and externally. Integrity is also key in this particular area of work in addition to having a strong eye for detail when carrying out analysis of data which can be extensive and complex.

Foremost I appreciate the Authority's supportive environment, which makes it a pleasant place to come into work. Colleagues are approachable and the office operates without any hierarchical barriers.
